NPA Criminology Level 5



What will I be learning?

The NPA Criminology course covers 3 topics:

- **Criminology: Crime in the Community**
You will learn the role of the media in reporting crime, different categories of crime and how crime is being addressed in the community through policing and the criminal justice system.
- **Crime and Law**
You will learn about the extent and causes of crime, the impact of crime on individuals and society, and the ways in which the police, the legal system, and the government tackle crime.
- **Forensic Science**
You will learn fundamental techniques of forensic science allowing you to develop skills in biology, chemistry, and physics.

How will I be assessed?

Level 5 Criminology consists of three unit assessments.

The outcomes are assessed under open-book conditions, meaning you have access to resources during your assessment. Your work needs to be your own individual work.

All assessments will be completed during class time.

What does homework look like?

You will receive at least one piece of homework per week. This may be to complete a task relating to a topic covered during the week.

All class resources will be uploaded onto Teams for you to access. These will also help you to catch up on anything you have missed throughout the year.
